### Matariki - te Timatanga o te Tau Hou Māori

This weekend, for the first time in Aotearoa, legislation has instituted a new national public holiday to celebrate **Matariki**. Māori, of course, have celebrated it for many hundreds of years as it marks the start of the Māori New Year. Mata (eyes) riki

(small) is the name given, in many parts of Aotearoa, to the appearance of the star cluster Pleiades in the early morning sky.

It is the star cluster you see on the badge of a Subaru Car.

Matariki invites us to pause and take stock. We are invited to prayerfully reflect upon the **past**: to remember our loved ones who have passed. This is what we do in the Church in November on All Souls Day and Matariki invites us to do something similar.

We are invited to look at the **present** and to be grateful for what we have: the love and care of our families and friends and the way that God has blessed us with the many gifts of nature and sustenance. We are grateful for the environment around us and the many ways we can preserve and protect it. We give thanks for the bounty of the earth and the sky.

We give thanks for the **future** and the plans we have for the coming year. It is a time for learning, sharing, discussion and decision making, especially concerning the environment.

Matariki is something that connects us with the indigenous culture and people of Aotearoa. Matariki will teach us important values and principles. It is something we can prayerfully incorporate into our spirituality here in our land of Aotearoa.
