## Hospitality of the Heart

Hospitality was a prized value in the Ancient Far East. Abraham and Sarah, offered it to three strangers who passed by. Mary and Martha offered it to Jesus when he came to visit. But what does true hospitality of the heart involve? Martha and Mary offer us a contrast in response to the presence of the guest. Mary assumes the position of a disciple sitting at the feet of a rabbi, a place normally reserved for men. Martha is in the kitchen clanking the pots and pans and getting anxious at the tasks of preparing food. Her problem is not that she is busy but that she is distracted and anxious. She seems to leave no room for the most important aspect of hospitality: gracious attention to the guest. She breaks all the rules of hospitality. Firstly she tries to shame her sister in front of a guest and then accuses Jesus of not caring about her and tries to get him involved in a family dispute. She tries to drive a wedge between herself and her sister and herself and Jesus. It is born of anxiety. Anxious to make a good impression, anxious to have everything perfect, anxious to be a success.

Mary shows a heart that is focused on giving space for the most important thing...to be nourished with God's word and God's presence. Activity that is not grounded in listening to God in prayer is likely to be anxious and pulled in many directions at once. Kia tupato.
