Next Week's Readings: (First Sunday of Lent)

Genesis 2:7-9, 3:1-7; Romans 5:12-19; Matthew 4:1-11

Ordinary Time - Yeah, right.

We have come to the end of a short period of Ordinary Time in the Church's year. It began following the birth of Jesus at Christmas, followed by the visit of the Magi and His Baptism in the Jordan. It has ended with the most significant weather event for some time in the history of Aotearoa/New Zealand. It has been far from ordinary.

So, in all of this, where has been the new-born Christ Child?

One way He has been present is in the numerous people who have come together to assist others in times of need. As the First Reading reminds us, "You must love your neighbour as yourself". The Reading expands the idea of love to include not holding grudges, not exacting vengeance, not bearing hatred for another in your heart. In times of suffering, those things are put to one side and compassion, empathy, resourcefulness take over — checking on the neighbours, offering shelter to strangers, praying, feeding the hungry, comfort to the afflicted, clothing those who have lost everything.

The Gospel expands the idea of who our neighbour is - "I say this to you, 'Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you' ". It seems to take a time of suffering to remind us that we are all sisters and brothers in Christ.

The time since Christmas, all eight weeks of it, has been far from ordinary. However, ordinary people have responded extraordinarily. The Christ Child is alive and present to us.
