<u>Next Week's Readings</u>: (Second Sunday of Lent) Genesis 12:1-4; 2 Timothy 1:8-10; Matthew 17:1-9

Today we are treated to the story of Jesus being tempted in the desert. In Matthew's gospel this story comes straight after his baptism when he is revealed as the Beloved Son of God. Immediately he is led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days. The desert was a place of solitude and preparation time.



Our period of Lent is a similar time when we are preparing ourselves too for Easter and for the Catechumens, reception of the Sacraments of Initiation. Jesus does it the opposite way round: he was baptised first and then went to the desert to prepare for his ministry. Our Catechumens both children and adults prepare in the desert of Lent for 40 days before they are baptised.

The first words that the Devil says to Jesus is "If you are the Son of God..." He wants Jesus to doubt his identity as God's Son and to derail his mission. Jesus has come in order to embrace our human condition which involves all that we go through like hunger and the Devil wants him to take a shortcut: You can use your position to benefit yourself. This is a similar temptation to Adam and Eve in the garden. They had to believe that God's word and obeying God's word was more important than any food like an apple no matter what it might give them. Jesus instead passes the test that Adam and Eve failed. He is not tempted either by a shortcut to power or to testing God so that he can gain instant fame. He will not try a 'power grab', he will wait until the power is given him by his Father. He wishes rather to associate himself with the poor rather than the powerful.

Please pray for our Catechumens and journey with them.
