Next Week's Readings: (Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time) Ecclesiasticus 15:15-20; 1 Corinthians 2:6-10; Matthew 5:17-37

Sermon on the Mount---Act 2

Last Sunday we heard Jesus give us the Beatitudes----the setting for them is commonly referred to as the 'Sermon on the Mount.'

Today's gospel passage is also taken from the 'Sermon on the Mount' where, using two simple metaphors, Jesus outlines the role of Christians in this world. We know what it's like to eat food that is flat and tasteless. The food might sustain the life of the body, but there is no zest, no joy, only an effort to get the food down. Jesus used the image of salt to describe how his disciples are to live in the world. Our task is to be the salt of the society, preserving, reconciling, adding taste, giving meaning where there is no meaning and giving hope where there is no hope.

Jesus used the image of a lamp to describe how his disciples are to live in the light of his truth and love. Just as a light eliminates darkness and enables us to see, so the light of Christ shines in the hearts of believers and enables us to see the heavenly reality of God's kingdom. Because of Him, we can have confidence that our light will shine and that our salt will flavour.
