Next Week's Readings: (Sunday of the Resurrection) Acts 10:34, 37-43; 1 Corinthians 5:6-8; John 20:1-9.

Palm Sunday 2023

There is so much that one could focus on in the readings for Palm Sunday. One key word that stands out to me is something that enshrines the whole of Jesus' work and purpose. That word is "covenant". This covenant is built on a commitment and is a pledge to be faithful to one another forever. Even if one side doesn't fulfill their side of the agreement, the other side still must uphold their end. Even though we sometimes break our end of the covenant through sin, God still upholds his end by continuing to love us. This is the covenant that we celebrate in each Eucharist.

At the Last Supper Jesus said, "Drink all of you from this, for this is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins." What Jesus was saying at the Last Supper was this: Because of my life, and above all because of my death, a new relationship has become possible between you and God. It's as if he said, "You have seen me; and in me you have seen God; I have told you and I have shown you how much God loves you. That is what God is like". Because of what Jesus did, the way for everyone is open to all the love that this covenant with God offers.

As we enter into Holy Week, let us reflect on and thank God for this new and everlasting covenant.

The theme for our liturgy is "Being one with Jesus, having something in common with Jesus". We do this in a number of ways.

One way is through The Rite of Washing of Feet. Jesus shows the disciples how they can have something in common with Him. He invites them to do the same, emphasizing love and service of each other. You are all invited to have your feet washed and to wash the feet of others. – family members, friends, fellow parishioners and so on. There will be multiple stations throughout the Church.

Another way is through Adoration at the Altar of Repose. It is our way of being one with Him in the Garden of Gethsemane. After Holy Communion, join the candle lit procession as we proceed to the Altar of Repose which will be outside in the School garden. There will be seats available. If you wish, bring cushions and blankets to sit or kneel on the ground. We will conclude our time with Night Prayers at 10pm.

Well over 5 thousand dollars was raised and it was a real collective effort.
