If you love me you will keep my commandments

Do we keep commandments out of duty or out of love? Most of us growing up learnt that in a family or a community there were rules and regulations. In Maoridom it is called "tikanga" or doing the right thing. Many of us grow up knowing what is right or wrong because we get growled at if we do the wrong thing and praised if we do the right thing. Today's gospel Jesus reminds us that doing the right thing is our way of showing we love someone.

God has given us guidelines for our lives because they are both good for us and good for others too. He has also given us the Holy Spirit to both be a guide and an empowerer. He is called the Paraclete. Which means a helper or guide, or advocate. When we get into a tricky situation he is alongside us to support us and help us. The disciples no longer had Jesus' physical presence with them after he ascended so he gave them the Holy Spirit to support and guide them. The Book of Acts is like the story of how the Holy Spirit helped the first Christian disciples. He helps us too when we go into new or tricky situations to do the right thing.

We can call upon the Holy Spirit to give us wisdom in difficult times and believe that we will receive it. When things are too much for us, give it over to the Holy Spirit thats what he was given for. The Spirit of Love will help us to love.
