

PENTECOST SUNDAY 28 May 2023 Year A


<u>Next Week's Readings</u>: (The Most Holy Trinity) Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9; 2 Corinthians 13:11-13; John 3:16-18.

Since his resurrection, Jesus been appearing to his disciples in visible and tangible form. These apparitions have been to individuals, pairs or small groups of disciples. Notable occasions for such encounters are when his disciples gather on every first day of the week (Sunday = the Lord's Day). He typically says "Peace be with you", shows them his wounds, breathes on them and says "Receive the Holy Spirit". These post-resurrection reunions with him are for the help and healing of those individuals, especially those like Peter who needed to be reconciled to the Lord because of their betrayal of him.

The individual disciples are healed, reconciled and remain in joy and peace. However, they still have not received all that the Father wants them to have. There is to be another outpouring of the Holy Spirit which will give them the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit so that they can become courageous and publicly identifiable members of Christ's Body, the Church. The Lord has ascended to Heaven in his proper physical Body and if there is anything more to be done on earth it must be done by his Body, the Church. In order for this to be a living body, it must have a soul. That soul is the Holy Spirit who came down upon the disciples at Pentecost in the form of wind and tongues of fire.

Just like Jesus' first disciples, we too receive a double anointing with the Holy Spirit. Once at our baptism and once at our confirmation. The first is more for us as individuals to free us from sin and to be reborn and conformed to Christ, the second is to make us courageous and active members of his Body, the Church alive in the Spirit and enthusiastically doing Christ's work on earth.
