

2 July 2023 Year A <u>Next Week's Readings</u>: (Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time) Zechariah 9:9-10; Romans 8:9, 11-13; Matthew 11:25-30

Hospitality and Service.

Our Sunday readings continue to instruct us in the essential elements of discipleship, and encourage us to make our relationship with God first in all we do. We are not all called to be apostles, or to be prophets like Elisha, but even the least among us have a share in the mission Christ gives to his Church.

In our 1st Reading we see a great example of sharing in God's work. The Shunammite woman wanted to be involved in the work of God and she did so in a way that was possible for her. She willingly opened her home to those in need and shared the good things that God had given her, provided hospitality to the prophet Elisha, and as a reward, she found favour with God and was promised a son. By her actions she participated in the work of God.

She is a great example for those among us who feel unable to be directly involved with the mission of evangelisation. The key, is to share what we have. What are your skills and talents and possessions that can contribute to the mission of the Church? Perhaps you are in trade or a professional in finances, law, engineering, medicine, education and so on. Could you offer your services for the benefit of those in need? If you have access to extra foods and grocery items, could you help our St Vincent de Paul Society with proving food for the hungry families in Northland? Being hospitable and serving others are among the basics of discipleship.

On top of all that, in the Gospel passage, Jesus says, true discipleship also requires prioritising our love and devotion to him. He is above everyone and everything in our lives - even family members!

He also stresses the importance of welcoming and supporting those who come in his name. If we do that, Jesus promises that even the smallest acts of kindness towards his disciples will be rewarded. We "will most certainly not lose his (our) reward."


The Catholic Caring Foundation is the Bishop's charity which assists vulnerable children, at risk youth, older people living in isolation, victims of domestic violence, refugees,
