## **Spiritual Farming**

Today's readings are a continuation of last Sunday's parable about the sower and the seed. They show that God is very patient and compassionate and is hopeful that the so called 'weeds' will be converted. The first reading gives us a picture of a merciful and patient God who governs with great leniency. The second reading reminds us that the Spirit of God goes on empowering us in our weakness and thus, we should be patient with ourselves. Finally, the gospel assures us that we are in the field of God.

How often have we been a weed in the garden of the Lord? After hearing and reflecting on these readings, how many of us would have wanted to be plucked up at those times when we were that weed? It's safe to say that none of us would! Therein lies one of the important life lessons to be taken from the readings: God wants us to take a good look into the field of our own lives to see what's growing there. Examine where the weeds are and take action on them. Above all, we need to be patient with ourselves as we invite God to work in our lives and get rid of the weeds.
