Forgiveness and Reconciliation


Jesus in today's gospel goes to the heart of an extremely important issue: how do I deal with someone in my family or community who has wronged me? How can we work through a process of reconciliation? It can be very difficult and messy stuff.

Matthew outlines a fairly clear process: if someone wrongs you (possibly without even realising) the first thing one does is go and talk to the person. That may be the only step needed. They may apologise and forgiveness can be given and the relationship healed. However, the other person may refuse to admit any fault and then a second step needs to be put into place: taking another person along with you to try and resolve the issue. If that does not work then a much greater number of people may have to be involved. Even after every effort is exhausted the person may still not admit fault or apologise and then further steps may be needed.

One thing Jesus does not advocate is that the person wronged becomes a doormat. He does not say "grin and bear it". He says that every effort must be taken to resolve the issue. However in the real world it takes two sides to be able to reconcile and one side cannot control the heart of another. Forgiveness is different however. It is being able to "forgive from the heart" even if reconciliation is not possible. It is a one-sided act of generosity and is for the sake of the person who has been wronged. That however is for more reflection next week. Let us pray that we can be a community of reconciliation always working to mend the ways we hurt one another.




