<u>Next Week's Readings</u>: (Twenty Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time) Isaiah 25:6-10; Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20; Matthew 22:1-14

## **Of Vineyards and Stones**

Jesus is in the Temple confronting the Chief Priests and the Elders and he tells them a parable about a vineyard. He takes the First Reading of today from Isaiah as his model but he reworks it. Isaiah was concerned most about the rotten fruit. Jesus was



concerned about the rotten hired workers. It is a pointed condemnation of the leadership of Israel, who like in Isaiah's day had not produced the fruit of justice and righteousness and instead made it all about themselves. He is telling a story about what is soon to be played out. That he the Son is about to be killed by them and that all the lunacy of the story is about to happen to him. It happens because the leadership has believed that the vineyard belonged to them and that they in their possessiveness could not recognise the Son in the parable, the rightful heir of the Vineyard. There is even a word play going on in the story in Hebrew...the Son (Ben) who was rejected has become the Cornerstone (Eben). God will turn the wickedness of the Jewish leaders into something new and wonderful but the vineyard will be given to a new group who will produce fruit. Jesus will become a new building, a new Temple. When we fail to see who we are and **what** we have as a pure gift from God, and working in the Vinevard of the Lord as a privilege, then we tend to think in a rather entitled way: that we own the vineyard. Its an easy trap to fall into. We must remember it is **God's** vineyard and we are merely workers in a much bigger project.
