Hmmmmmm

In our Gospel, we hear the parable about a Master entrusting property to his servants.

The first impression is that of a generous Master who entrusts His property to others in proportion to their abilities. We have one being given five talents, one being given two and the third servant being given one. It is not about who is the most favoured or who is the best. The distribution is according to each one's ability. The master knows the servants well enough to know what they are able to manage. This master isn't some remote boss who doesn't have much to do with the servants. The master knows each of them and their abilities intimately. He is not out to trip them up or catch them out. He has carefully considered a course of action according to the abilities of each of the servants.

The second impression is of a hard Master who reaps where He has not sown and gathers where He has not scattered. He is a master who invokes fear and stifles any risk taking or initiative. It is best not to have any dealings with him whatsoever. As for what is given by the master, just give it back.

If the Master represents God, then we are given two impressions of God.

The first is of a generous, caring God who knows each of us personally and knows our abilities. God doesn't set us up to fail. Rather, God is pleased with our faithfulness in small things, and we are invited to join in God's happiness.

The second is that of a God to be feared, who makes us afraid. It is best not to do anything with what is given to us.

The first impression of God comes from Jesus. The second impression of God comes from the servant [us?]

Let us ensure that our understanding of God comes from Jesus and not from ourselves.




We gather at 5pm on the first and third Thursday of the month. First Thursday we pray the Rosary and 3rd Thursday we have a meeting. All welcome.
