Recharging Our Batteries

Today's gospel teaches us that for Jesus, true discipleship meant getting ,involved in selfless service of others. During the day, He took part in the synagogue worship, taught with authority, exorcised a demon, healed Simon's mother-in-law and in the evening he cured many who were sick with various diseases, and drove out many demons."

Towards the end of the gospel reading, Mark makes a point of telling us that "very early in the morning Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed." Jesus was convinced that if he were going to spend himself for others by his preaching and healing ministry, He would repeatedly have to summon spiritual reinforcements. He knew that He could not live without prayer because his teaching and healing ministry drained him of power.

Our daily activities can also drain us of our spiritual power and vitality. Our mission of bearing witness to God in our everyday routines requires spiritual energy which comes to us through daily anointing by the Holy Spirit. So, just like Jesus, we need to be recharged spiritually and rejuvenated every day by prayer – listening to God and talking to Him so that our spiritual batteries can be recharged. Although we are already into the month of February, it's not too late to make this one of our New Year resolutions!




