

# **Exulting in Christ's victory**

Christians have a victory song too because in a very literal sense, Easter is an astonishing triumph. It is the final result of an epic battle between God and Satan, between light and darkness, life and death. It is our perpetual reminder that God has saved us from spiritual slavery in Egypt, namely, sin, by sending His Son to do battle for ourselves.

Everything about the Resurrection radiates the glorious victory Christ won on Calvary and for that reason, Easter has its own song, which is the most beautiful song the Church has to offer!

The ancient hymn of the Church is called the Easter Exsultet, that latter term being the first word of the Latin hymn. "Let [the host of heaven] exult". It is also called the Easter Proclamation.

It passes us by. I offer you a taste in Lent of the things to come. It is worthy of prayer and meditation.

O truly blessed night, worthy alone to know the time and hour when Christ rose from the underworld! This is the night of which it is written: The night shall be as bright as day, dazzling is the night for me, and full of gladness. The sanctifying power of this night dispels wickedness, washes faults away

restores innocence to the fallen. and joy to mourners, drives out hatred, fosters concord, and brings down the mighty. On this, your night of grace. O holy Father, accept this candle, a solemn offering, the work of bees and of your servants' hands, an evening sacrifice of praise, this gift from your most holy Church."
