Next Week's Readings: Fourth Sunday of Easter

Acts 4:8-12; 1 John 3:1-2; John 10: 11-18

Seeing is believing

This morning's gospel shares something with several of the readings that we've heard after Easter. The recurring theme is about recognizing Jesus. In today's gospel Luke tells us that the two disciples initially thought they were seeing a ghost. As the story evolves, Luke stresses the physical presence of Jesus so that the disciples would see him with real flesh and bones and believe in the risen Jesus.....resulting in an increase in their faith. But, what about those of us who haven't seen Jesus in his physical body.....flesh and bones? Sure, all of us have heard about a risen Jesus but would it have the same impact on our faith as seeing him in the flesh? The fact of the matter is that all of us actually see the physical Jesus every time we attend Mass.

The same Jesus who, in the upper room on Holy Thursday, consecrated bread and wine into His body and blood is very much present with us in our Eucharistic celebration. There is a challenge involved here for us: Do we really believe that the host we receive is really the body of Christ? Do we believe that the chalice contains the reality of the blood of Christ? Or, do we think that they just 'symbolize' Christ's presence? Maybe we don't even bother to think about it. Are we on automatic pilot when we receive them?

** We aren't asked to fully or even adequately understand the Eucharist. Our faith only asks that we are faithful in participating in it. Luke wrote that Jesus invited the two disciples to touch his hands and his feet and, as he showed his hands and feet to them, "they were incredulous with joy and were amazed." As we approach the Blessed Sacrament for Holy Communion, let us feel the joy and amazement at what we are receiving, AMEN.


