FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER 21 April 2024 Year B

Next Week's Readings: Fifth Sunday of Easter Acts 9:26-31: 1 John 3:18-24: John 15: 1-8.

It has been estimated that a New Zealand sheep-farmer would need to run 3,000 sheep in order to take care of a family. In Ireland sheep-farmers enjoy state subsidies and could get by on a flock of only 300. In France the agricultural subsidies are so high that merely 30 sheep can keep the family in substantial comfort and security. The typical shepherd in Jesus' time would have had something like this latter number but would have lived very simply and almost at subsistence level without the advantages afforded by EU membership.

Despite being amongst the poorest of the poor, shepherds were in a sense respected because their occupation in a certain way reminded people of God's relationship with the people of Israel – often He is referred to as the "Shepherd of Israel". cf Psalm 22.


Jesus enters this picture and just like God is called the Shepherd of Israel, He proclaims himself the Shepherd of the New Israel, the Church. He is not a hireling, He is the Good Shepherd who cares for the sheep and is prepared to sacrifice his own life for theirs.

The Pastors that He has placed in charge of the flock to carry on his ministry of Shepherd, the Bishops and their assistants the Priests along with the Deacons are to be like him good shepherds, not selfish hirelings, to spend themselves and be spent for the Church and to do offer themselves in the service of the Church and move out beyond her visible confines to reach out and introduce others into His sheepfold.

On this Good Shepherd Sunday, please join your prayers together with those of the Holy Mass, that the Priests and Deacons of Whangarei be good shepherds after the Heart of Jesus.


